Old Postcards Can Add Interest to Your Family Story:

You might like to enhance your family story with a few postcards from the past depicting the town or city where your ancestors lived. There are many to be found on the web. I Googled, "postcards, Alameda,CA", and found quite a nice collection. I was also able to find several for Leavenworth, KS; but, unfortunately very few for Westcliffe, CO., as I expected. Try searching for some postcards where your ancestors lived. You may be pleasantly surprised.

Mini Yearbooks:

In recent years these were produced at class reunions, probably beginning in the 1950s, and might include earlier graduating classes that held class reunions since the 1950s. A great source for finding a female's maiden name. Most have named photographs of attendees and an index of class members including spouse's names, phone numbers and addresses. These little booklets may not be easy to find. Try local libraries or genealogical or historical societies. If that doesn't pan out, try locating a yearbook for the school your ancestor attended and then try to locate a male from that class in the local telephone directory. You may be fortunate enough to find

that that person attended a class reunion and has a copy of a Mini-Yearbook (or knows of someone who does) and could give you the information you are seeking.

WHERE THERE IS A WILL...

One day in April 2009, as I was exploring the Books.Google.com site, I searched for one of my ggggrand-fathers, John Love. To my surprise and delight I found a reference to him in *Reports of Cases at Law and in Chancery, Argued and Determined in the Supreme Court of Illinois, Volume 292, Containing cases in which Opinions were filed in April. 1920, and Cases wherein Rehearings were denied at the April Term, 1920.*

John Love and his wife Eleanor had eight children born between 1835 and 1854: Margaret, Sarah, Maria, William, Robert, Harriet, Charles, and Camilla. William died in 1864. I believe something happened to Margaret and her husband by 1870, because in the 1870 census three of their young children were living with relatives, including two with their grandfather, John Love. Thus, John apparently had six children still living at the time of his death in 1888.

In John's will, written in December 1886, 40 acres of land were left for the support of son Robert, whio could not take care of himself for some reason. Upon the death of Robert, the land was to revert to his nearest akin. This will does not mention the other children at all. Robert died in 1918, leaving no widow, parent or child; but rather, a sister (Camilla), a brother (Charles), seven nieces and five nephews. John's other three children had died by this time,.

Camilla petitioned the court to divide the land between her and Charles. The rest of the family felt the estate should be shared fourteen ways among the two surviving siblings and the twelve children of the five deceased siblings. The lower court agreed. However, Camilla appealed the decision. After studying John's will, especially the term "nearest akin", the Supreme Court ruled that this phrase must be held to mean nearest blood relative. Manifestly, a sister and a brother are nearer blood relations than a niece or a nephew. The judges ruled in the sister's favor and remanded the case to the lower court for further proceedings.

It was fascinating to read how this case was decided and to get a glimpse into the family problems. The best part for me was a paragraph which named the mothers of these nieces, who had been mentioned in a document I had found the previous summer. I knew which families the nephews belonged in, but did not know in which family the nieces belonged, due to name changes when the women married. Now this branch of my family tree is more complete.

Many questions remain. Was there animosity for some reason among the family members? Robert, the son with problems, had lived with three of his sisters and their families at one time or another, Did the nieces and nephews feel they deserved some payment for having this uncle in their homes, possibly disrupting their lives? Is this an example of somebody demanding fair and equal treatment? Those of us from the Midwest tend to have an overly strong sense of what is fair and what is not. Questions like this cannot be answered now, unless there is a diary or letters somewhere with more information. So, I'll have to be satisfied with the names I have found...until the next discovery!
