If you live in the Bay Area, have you gotten your free Alameda County Library Card?

You can access World Vital Records from home with an Alameda County Library Card. World Vital Records has a fabulous database which may prove very useful in your research.

Legacy.com: A great place to shop online for genealogy books and software. When you get to the site, click on "Software & Books" on the left of the screen. You will enjoy browsing through their many selections of software, books and e-books available.

German Research: For those interested in German research, let me pass on a good website that I have found very useful, **Genealogy.net**. and it is FREE.

Try Meta Search first. While I did not find a lot using that with the full name, I did get results using just the last name. From those results I picked out the ones that I knew were related to my families. Also on that page, try the Heritage Books. It is in German, but you get a lot of families if your particular area in Germany has been published. These are from the various church family books and the record sources are given. RESEARCHING IN OHIO

The following information is from Richard Ferman's handout at the November meeting.

The Ohio Network of American History Research Centers was established in 1970 to aid in the collection, preservation, and accessibility of research materials related to Ohio History. The Network is composed of eight institutions, Ohio's largest historical societies, five universities, and one museum.

It is important to remember that you may want to extend your research into Contra Costa County for the cities of Richmond and Berkeley in northern Alameda County.. And, in the case of Pleasanton, Dublin or Livermore, perhaps into Amador County or southern Contra Costa County. For southern Alameda County perhaps into Santa Clara County for the cities of Fremont or Newark.

Residents of Alameda County that have recently moved from other counties or even states are likely to be buried where they previously resided, although a local mortuary will most likely have to handle the transport arrangements.

Hint: Obituaries for recent residents may, perhaps, not be found in Alameda County newspapers but in local newspapers where they previously resided.

Cities within the county are listed alphabetically with cemeteries and mortuaries combined listed alphabetically. Research in Contra Costa County or Santa Clara County for Southern Alameda County is also recommended. Many Berkeley and some early San Leandro burials before 1908 were at Mt. View Cemetery in Oakland. Since then, most Berkeley burials are in Contra Costa County, and for that reason I have listed the two cemeteries located in Contra Costa County.*

There are NO cemeteries located in the cities of Alameda, Albany, Berkeley, Castro Valley, Emeryville, Newark, Piedmont or Union City.

Two good sources for Roman Catholic records are the Diocese of Oakland for all Alameda County Catholic cemetery records and St. Patrick's Seminary for Alameda County Roman Catholic churches prior to 1956.
